Sheryl Punia Installed as New President

GREENWOOD HOUSE members and friends gathered on June 18 for the 2009 business meeting and installation of board members. A cocktail reception began the evening to welcome incoming President, Sheryl Punia.

Rick Goldstein, Executive Director, gave an overview of the past year's activities, and updates on recent accomplishments. Rick noted that the Robert and Natalie Marcus Home for the Jewish Aged recently received a five-star rating for overall quality from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, the highest rating possible. "Our reputation for providing high quality nursing care is known throughout the area and for this reason, we are one of the few skilled nursing facilities to have a census of 100% and a waiting list," he said. "In June 2009, five beds were added to the Robert and Natalie Marcus Home for the Jewish Aged and five apartments at the Abrams Residence. We are pleased to be serving 166 residents here at our homes, along with local community

members through our homemaker and hospice programs."

Before the installation of officers, Membership Chairperson Joel Orland made a presentation to outgoing President Rick Pollock. "I had the pleasure of co-chairing the 2006 Greenwood House Gala with Rick, raising over \$340,000 for the expansion of the Robert and Natalie Marcus Home. It is quite fitting that now, three years later, Rick is ending his term as President with the expansion completed," said Joel.

In her opening comments as President, Sheryl Punia reminisced about visiting the original Greenwood House with her mother. A resident of Mercer County for 50+ years, Sheryl has strong connections to many community organizations. "I've always been involved in community life, including serving as President of Women's Division of UJA and Chair of the Princeton Alcohol and Drug Alliance. I'm currently a Trustee of the Hun School and a Board member of the Jewish Community Foundation. It seems

that I've been involved as a volunteer or active member in every Jewish organization in Mercer County at one time or another," she said.

In her professional career, Sheryl was a teacher and guidance counselor in the East Windsor school district for 15 years, and for the last 18 years has worked at Corner Counseling Center in Princeton as a drug and alcohol prevention specialist. Sheryl lives in Princeton with her husband Joe where they raised their children, Elyse and Charlie.

Speaking to the board members in attendance, Sheryl said, "I took this job as Board President because I know many of you, and I am fully aware of the commitment, intelligence, and talent on this board. We need to utilize the expertise of all our board members to ensure that Greenwood House continues to be a leader and model for quality care."

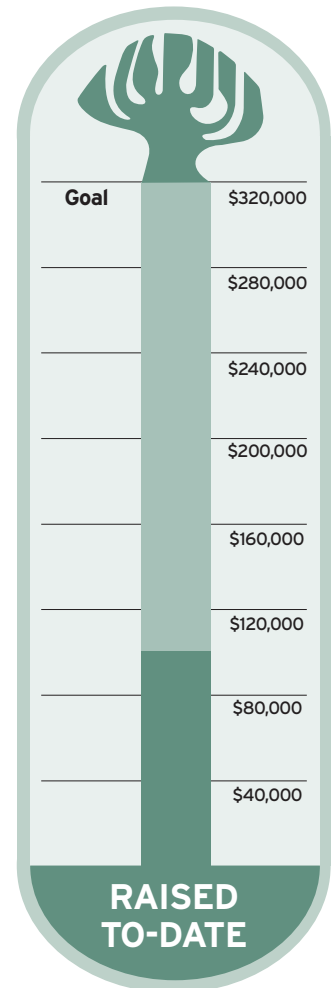

From the Desk of the Executive Director

OVER THE YEARS, GREENWOOD HOUSE has expanded our services to include assisted living and homemaker services, hospice care, and community meals on wheels.

It is ironic that our oldest, most vital and in-demand service is one not highly valued by our community. Most people have a negative perception about nursing homes and for most families, the first time they enter Greenwood House is when they are in crisis. No one wants to think a loved one might need to live in a nursing home at some time.

We offer our community, at great cost, the finest skilled nursing care in a warm and caring environment. Amazingly, there is still enough demand for our high quality services that we are one of the last sectarian Jewish homes in the country.

It would be easier if our organization were nonsectarian and admitted individuals based on their ability to pay. If we did, we would be overwhelmed with private-pay admissions, but access to care for the Jewish community would be drastically limited.

We need charitable dollars to continue our mission, but our nursing home is not always a priority for Jewish donors. I see it in very simple terms, either we raise more funds from the Jewish community or we provide less care to the Jewish community.

Greenwood House Artist in Residence

GREENWOOD HOUSE RESIDENT Albert Moser has been sketching beautiful designs for forty years. Using marking pens and colored pencils, Albert turns a plain white piece of paper into a kaleidoscope of color and design in just a few days.

Watching Albert sketch is an exercise in precision. Working at a small desk, he reaches into his shirt pocket and pulls out a vintage Stanley folding ruler. After taking a measurement, he starts in the middle of a sheet of paper with a single dot that becomes a pivot point for his intricate designs.

He chooses a particular shape from his collection to begin. What others discard, Albert views as a template and immediately thinks of how he might use it in one of his designs. If he doesn't have a shape, he will create one from card stock.

A self-taught artist, Albert likes to sketch with a pen and is meticulous. "I go slowly and if I make a little mistake I can camouflage it. If you go too fast, you make a big mistake and it's not as easy to fix," he explains.

When asked if he has a favorite design, Albert replied "What child is your favorite? You love them all." While no two pieces are alike, there is symmetry in all his work, and many pieces

feature a 16-point star in yellow and blue. Most of his work is vividly colored in blues, yellows, green and pink, while others are stark black and white compositions.

Albert recently entered one of his designs in the Mercer County Senior Art Show at the Robbinsville Senior Center. A juried art show, over 75 works of art were featured, including acrylics, oils, mixed media, photography, watercolor and works on paper. At a reception on August 27 Albert, accompanied by Greenwood House Social Worker Sharon Lustig, received a certificate of recognition for his participation in the show. 🍀

George Warren Remembered



George Warren, 94, died peacefully on Sunday June 21, 2009, at Greenwood House. Mr. Warren was an honorary member of the Greenwood House Board of Trustees and played a major role in the two largest construction and fundraising projects for the home.

Mr. Warren, along with Natalie Marcus, led the historic fund drive to build the new Greenwood House in the early 1970's. As chairman of the *Committee for a New Greenwood House*, a campaign was launched that raised over \$1,200,000, more money than in any single fundraising effort in the history of Trenton.

Sooner than anyone anticipated, demand for more beds grew and in the late 1970's, George Warren and Natalie Marcus once again joined forces to co-chair another campaign. The new campaign, *Greenwood House Takes Wing*, was a \$650,000 fundraising effort to add 50 beds, a new dining room, synagogue, and additional space to the home.

George Warren understood the importance of having a home that provided care, compassion, and support for Jewish elderly. While many know of his involvement through these two major fundraising efforts, his work on behalf of Greenwood House started much earlier. (see below)

Greenwood House Memories, George Warren, 1992

"Greenwood House has been a tradition in our family from the time it was created as a project of the Trenton Ladies Benefit Society of which my mother was a founding member. It was named after the street on which the Ladies found a run-down house that, with contributions from their members, they were able to buy. If my memory serves, the repairs were done mainly by husbands. If I had not been too young and clumsy I'm sure my mother would have volunteered my services. At any rate, my early recollections were helping unload the items she and her friends collected for Greenwood House to use. I particularly remember being pressed into service on Saturdays to go to the fruit and vegetable markets whose warehouses were located on Tucker Street, a few blocks from where we lived. This routine took place only in summertime for a practical reason. In those days, refrigeration consisted of blocks of ice which, of course, melted overnight so that perishables rotted over the weekend. Knowing this, the Ladies convinced the Popkins and the Litowitzes, who competed a few doors from each other, to give them whatever they had not sold by Saturday that might spoil by Monday."

We remember George Warren with gratitude and warmth.

Q&A with Judy Millner

Dear Judy:

My parents are in their mid-80's and in good health, but they both take a number of medications. Some pills are supposed to be taken daily, others weekly, and a few have particular instructions, like take after a meal. When I stop by to visit there is usually a small pile of pills in the middle of the kitchen table. My parents insist they know exactly what to take, but I'm worried they might forget to take some of their medications or take the other one's prescription by mistake. Do you have any suggestions?

Dear Bob:

I often hear concerns from children, spouses, and friends about loved ones forgetting to take medications, or sometimes adjusting what they take without contacting their doctor.

Some people don't like the way a particular pill "makes them feel" and decide to stop taking it; others take all

their pills in the morning to make it "easier". Whatever the reason, medications need to be taken exactly as directed, and should never be skipped.

Greenwood House offers a comprehensive Medication Management program to help clients understand and manage their medications safely and easily.

The program starts with a visit from a registered nurse who does a complete physical assessment and review of the client's medications. Our nurse reviews all medications, and asks the client questions about how they are taken, and if they are having problems with any of them.

The nurse then prepares a written medication schedule in compliance with physician orders. A weekly pillbox is organized according to the client's individual needs, with medications sorted by day, time, and special instructions. The pre-sorted pillbox makes it easy for clients to maintain their medication schedule in an easy-to-understand and safe way.

Every week our nurse visits to review the client's health status and checks to see if all medications were taken

properly. She will refill the pillbox and reorder any needed medication. If there are any concerns about a client's condition, including medication side effects, the nurse will contact the client's physician.

I can tell you from personal experience how effective this program is. On a recent client visit, I noticed that a particular medication was being taken daily. As a practicing registered nurse, I knew the medication was also available in a weekly form, which would be much easier for the client to manage. After contacting the client's physician and getting approval, we were able to reduce a five-day-a-week pill to once a week. This new schedule was easier for the client to manage and less expensive!

The program cost is \$35 per week plus a \$150 set-up charge. But for a limited time you can pay \$70 for your first month of service and the set-up fee is waived - a savings of \$220! A Conversation With Bobbi Daugherty, Administrator

AFTER WORKING IN HOSPICE for over 25 years I still get the same questions as when I first started. It is disappointing that more progress has not been made to help people understand what Hospice is about. There are still many misconceptions and myths as evidenced by the questions I am asked by community members, friends, and even my own family.

We live in a society where people are constantly searching for information to educate themselves. Whether it is about what schools their children will attend; what health care providers they will use, or what community they want to live in, at every stage of life we have an insatiable need for more information - every stage except one.

I understand that hospice can be a difficult subject to discuss, but this is usually because people are confused about what hospice really is. I have listed below a few of the most common questions I receive.

How do I know when my loved one needs hospice services?

Most people assume their doctor will let them know when they need hospice care, but that is not always the

case. There is nothing wrong with you bringing up the subject with your doctor or calling a hospice provider like Community Hospice of Greenwood House. There is no "right" time; families and individuals can call for information or an assessment at any time during a life-limiting illness.

My mother would never want to "give up" and use hospice services.

Using hospice services is not about giving up, it is about providing a greater quality of continued life. And if a patient's condition improves and the disease seems to be in remission, they can be discharged from hospice and return to aggressive therapy or go on about their daily life.

What does pain management mean? I do not want my family member to be in pain, but I want to be able to talk to them and have them awake and aware as much as possible.

It is the goal of hospice to have the patient as pain free and alert as possible so they can participate in life

activities. Pain management does not mean sedation. Hospice nurses and doctors are up to date on the latest medications for pain and symptom relief, and complementary therapies like massage and aromatherapy can help alleviate or minimize pain and discomfort. Using a combination of medications, counseling and therapies, most patients can attain a level of comfort they consider acceptable.

I do not want my loved one to be afraid of what is happening.

When I talk to patients they often tell me that their family is trying to protect them by not talking about how they are feeling or the illness. Many times the patient may be ready for hospice services, but the family is not. Social workers and spiritual counselors, including clergy, are available to assist family members and patients address these emotional issues. I always tell people that hospice helps patients achieve physical and emotional comfort so they can concentrate on living.

The Abrams Residence

JOSEPHINE STEINKLEIN'S many photographs throughout her home provide a glimpse into her interesting life. She traveled to multiple countries and is fluent in German and English, and speaks some Romanian and Spanish as well. Her sharp wit, sense of humor and exceptional memory for dates represent a life well lived.

Josephine and her twin sister were born on July 30, 1917 in Austria. "When my sister and I were born prematurely, I was the weaker twin and my mother was told I would never reach adult age. When my mother was taking us home from the hospital, she wanted to show her gratitude to one of the nurses who was so wonderful and nurtured us. The nurse, who didn't have any children of her own, asked that one of the babies be named after her and that is how I became Josephine. I never asked my mother what she would have named me otherwise!"

When her father immigrated to America after World War I, Josephine along with her sister and mother, remained in Romania with her maternal grandparents and her mother's siblings. On January 23, 1931, Josephine who was now thirteen, and her mother and sister joined her father in Brooklyn. "I grew up overnight," she said reflecting back on her arrival to the states, "I never touched my dolls again. It was hard for us when we first came to America."

She she attended City College of New York and in 1941 began her career in Washington D.C. She later worked in Chicago for the railroad retirement board. "I really wanted to go to Chicago, but when I went to the regional director to apply for a transfer he said I didn't have a chance because there was such a long waiting list. But I applied anyway and got it." she says with pride, "but it was so cold there I had to come home!" After moving back to New York Josephine married William Steinklein in 1944 with whom she raised two children, her son Jay and her daughter Irene.

Josephine is now living at the Abrams Residence "When I first walked in I stretched my arms open and said this is paradise! I love people so I was happy the minute I came in. I just jumped right in like jumping into the ocean."

Josephine chose to come to the Abrams Residence to be closer to her daughter and grandchildren. She is the happy grandmother of five and a great-grandmother of three.

Josephine participates in many of the programs offered at the Abrams Residence but especially likes the word games. "I like everything here. I love the people. We all have similar experiences. We are all born, we have children, we all get old," Josephine

says jokingly. "It's how people take life. I take it with a sense of humor!" Josephine's great love for travel, art, and opera are reflected in the pieces of art, photographs, and music that occupy her Abrams apartment. Next to her bed hangs a Certificate of Loyal Service and letter of gratitude from the U.S. government that marks one of the many great accomplishments of her life.

Josephine's zest for life, personality, and story makes her one of the many amazing people you can get to know at the Abrams Residence. 🌱

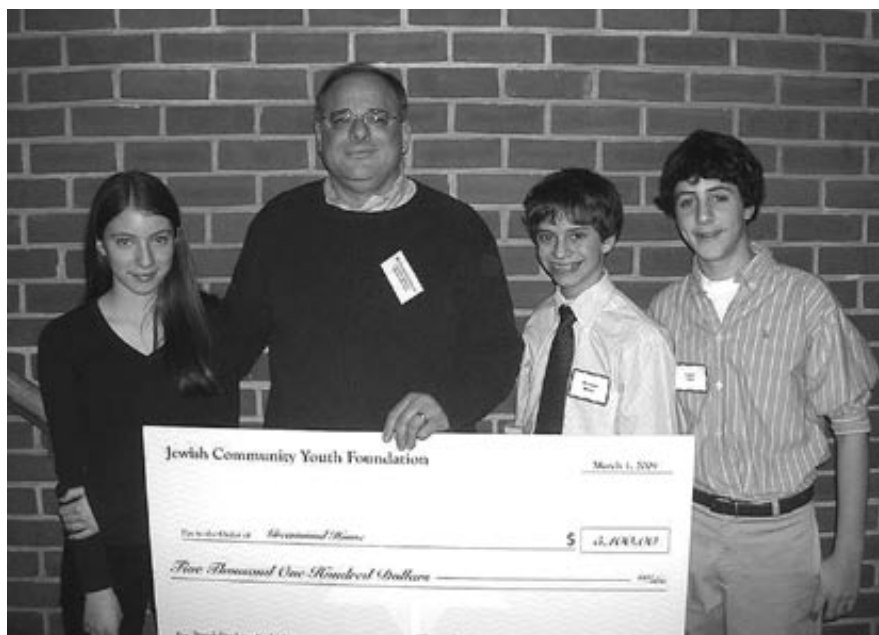

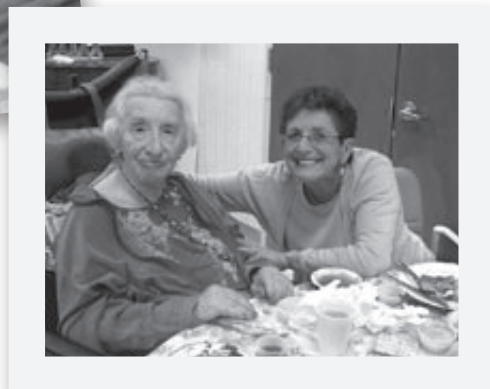
